

Cookies on the Studio Warwick Website

When you visit our website we use cookies. Cookies allow us to identify the type of computer or device you're using to access our websites, how you use our website and how you found our website – but we can't identify you personally in any way.

You can set up your web browser to refuse cookies, but this means you won't be able use all of the website features.

What do we use cookies for?

- Operating our Website: This means that you can navigate around and use the features of our website.
- Collecting information: This means we can learn more about how you use our website so we can improve our products and online experience.

Types of cookies we use

Here are the types of cookies our website uses and some more details about what they're used for:

- Application Cookies: These cookies allow us to make sure you get the best possible experience on our website.
- Analytical Cookies: These cookies help us understand how our customers are using the website, so we can make things better.

What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files placed on your computer by us or by Google. They let us identify the device you're using – but not you personally. This information is sent back to Google as you move around our website.

Cookies are unique to the web browser you're using – so if you're using a desktop computer as well as a mobile, different data will be collected for each.

Cookies can be set by the owner of the website you're on. These are known as 1st Party Cookies. There are also 3rd Party Cookies that can be set by partner websites. Only the owner of the cookie can see the anonymous information it collects.

You can choose to accept all cookies, reject 3rd Party Cookies or reject all cookies by changing your internet browser settings. If you don't accept cookies, some features of our website won't work.

Refusing cookies

You can change your browser settings to accept or refuse all cookies, choose which cookies you want or don't want, or ask to be notified when a cookie is set. Use the help feature in your browser to see how.
